2024 Central States COMMEX

Participants from Iowa made a significant impact at the 2024 Central States Communication Exercise (COMMEX) in Joplin, MO. Out of 29 states and 314 individual registrants, Iowa was prominently recognized during the closing ceremonies. Only two honors were given that evening, and Iowa was called to the stage for both, underscoring the state's leadership in interoperable communications.

The Story County Team earned accolades for their outstanding teamwork and dedication. On the first day of exercise, they secured 1st place in the NIFOG Escape Room challenge. When their time was surpassed on day two, they were undeterred and took on the more complex NCSWIC escape room box, a task typically requiring two hours and was not initially part of this event. Driven by their competitive spirit, strong leadership, and team unity, they completed the challenge 30 minutes faster than any previous team.

SFC Mills of Iowa's 71st Civil Support Team was at the event working toward his COM-L and was acknowledged by his evaluator for exceptional innovative insight and forethought, hard work, and dedication in a communications exercise.
