Note From the SWIC

As I write this, much remains uncertain, but I want to share what we know at this moment, hoping that by the time the next newsletter arrives with the spring tulips, things will have evolved. Significant changes are expected before the next publication, so I encourage you to attend our committee meetings and participate in your Regional Interoperability Committee (RIC) meetings. These meetings provide a valuable opportunity to connect with local users, discuss topics relevant to your needs, and raise awareness of issues that others may not yet recognize.

I received notice on Friday February 21st that there has been a pause on the grant funds allocated to the iMED project. This is the grant in which \$1.8 million was awarded to ISICSB to fund radio equipment and emerging technology to improve EMS to hospital communications. This project is well underway, and equipment is ordered, in-transit, and in some cases ready for install; employee payroll also currently depends on these funds to be dispersed. This is all the information I have at this time.

Legislation has been introduced in the 91st lowa Assembly that, if passed, will affect the lowa Statewide Interoperability Communications System. In this newsletter you will see links to the bill introduced in the Senate and the corresponding bill that has been introduced in the House.

As we look ahead to 2025, there is much to anticipate in what promises to be an impactful year. The iMED project is expected to continue making a significant difference across Region 1. A Communications Unit Leader (COML) course is scheduled in Council Bluffs in time for the unpredictable spring weather season and the busy summer months, with RAGBRAI having a confirmed route in the northern tier of the state. Iowa remains committed to leading interoperable best practices for public safety and public services, ensuring the highest levels of security and oversight while expanding user engagement through training, outreach, exercises, and presentations.
