Michael Colby—Representing Municipal Police Department



Chief Mike Colby grew up in West Des Moines Iowa, graduating from Valley High School. After high school he attended Florida Atlantic University (FAU), studying marine biology. After attending FAU, he moved back to West Des Moines and obtained associate's degree in criminal justice from Des Moines Area Community College (DMACC),

a bachelor's degree in criminal justice leadership from William Penn University, and a Masters in Leadership Development from Drake University.

Mike started his law enforcement career with the Clive, Iowa Police Department in July of 2001, as a Police Officer. During his time working in Clive, he served as a narcotics investigator, field training officer, chairman of the Central Iowa Traffic Safety Task Force, was a certified Drug Recognition Expert (DRE), a certified Accident Investigator (AI). He then moved to Clear Lake with his wife and their three kids in August of 2016, when he was appointed Captain. As the department's only Captain, Chief Colby oversaw the Clear Lake Police Department Operations Division consisting of Uniform Patrol and Investigations. In May of 2023, Chief Colby was appointed Interim Chief of Police before permanently being appointed as Clear Lake's Chief of Police in October 2023.

Chief Colby is a graduate of Northwestern University's School of Police Staff and Command (SPSC). He enjoys spending time working with officers and citizens, creating a progressive police department, and serving the Clear Lake and Ventura communities. Chief Colby is also a member of Clear Lake Noon Lions Club, and Zion Lutheran Church. In his off-time He enjoys boating in the summer, attending Clear Lake's many special events, and hunting upland game in the fall and winter. He especially enjoys spending time in Florida at the beach with his family whenever possible.

Chief Colby joined the ISICS Board in May 2025. He is also the Chair of the ISICSB Governance Committee.
