



The Helmsley Charitable Trust aspires to improve lives by supporting exceptional efforts in the U.S. and around the world in health and select place-based initiatives. Since beginning active grantmaking in 2008, Helmsley has committed nearly \$3 billion for a wide range of charitable purposes. Helmsley's Rural Healthcare Program funds innovative projects that use information technologies to connect rural patients to emergency medical care, bring the latest medical therapies to patients in remote areas, and provide state-of-the-art training for rural hospitals and EMS personnel. To date, the Rural Healthcare Program has awarded more than \$496 million to organizations and initiatives in the upper Midwest states of Iowa, Minnesota, Montana, Nebraska, North Dakota, South Dakota, and Wyoming.

#### Mission: Lifeline • \$4.6 million

12-leads for EMS and hospitals to enhance diagnosis of STEMI heart attacks and expedite necessary transfers



#### LUCAS™2 • \$6.3 million

Life-saving CPR equipment that provides high quality automated chest compressions, working towards statewide system of cardiac care



#### AEDs for First Responders • \$10.1 million

Provide training and place automated external defibrillators (AEDs) with every law enforcement agency in the state to expedite response time in an emergency



#### Conservation • \$0.6 million

Restoration of historic structures at Backbone State Park



#### Radiology Equipment • \$5.2 million

New computed tomography (CT) scanners and portable and fixed x-ray equipment in Critical Access Hospitals



#### Cancer Care • \$3.1 million

**Radiation Therapy:** Access to linear accelerator and treatment within a 100 mile drive

**Digital Mammography:** New or updated technology to full-field digital mammography within a 60 mile drive



#### Telehealth • \$9.0 million

Increase access to emergency and pharmacy telehealth services that benefit both patients and Critical Access Hospitals by improving patient care, supporting the rural workforce, and assisting with financial stability



#### Advocacy & Education • \$2.6 million

Support the work of the Rural Policy Research Institute (RUPRI) at the University of Iowa to provide unbiased analysis and information on healthcare challenges and opportunities in rural America



#### Simulation In Motion (SIM) • \$8.2 million

Statewide mobile education training program utilizing high fidelity human patient simulators to launch in 2022
