NARRATIVE

Narrative of Offense Committed

On or about the above stated date and time, the Defendant did having malice aforethought, kill TIMOTHY CHARLES FECHTER, while participating in a forcible felony, to wit: MURDER

AFFIDAVIT

STATE OF IOWA, ADAIR COUNTY

I, the undersigned, being duly sworn, state that all facts contained in this Complaint and Affidavit, known by me or told to me by other reliable persons form the basis for my belief that the defendant committed this crime

State all facts and persons relied upon supporting elements of alleged crime

On June 21st, 2021 at 9:35am, TIMOTHY CHARLES FECHTER was reported as missing to the Creston Police Department. I, Special Agent Chris Spencer, was called by Special Agent-in-charge Adam DeCamp at approximately 1230 p.m. SAC DeCamp requested that I provide the Creston Police Department assistance investigating the disappearance of FECHTER.

The interviews conducted showed that on the early morning hours of June 20th, FECHTER was at his home in Creston with KEAGEN TREMBLY and DUSTIN SELEY. FECHTER and SELEY are biological brothers. According to TREMBLY, at approximately 3:00am, FECHTER and SELEY left the home and drove away in FECHTER'S red Chevrolet pickup. TREMBLY also described the clothing that both FECHTER and SELEY were wearing when they left. This is the last time FECHTER was known to have been seen. TREMBLY provided this information to law enforcement on June 21st.

During a search warrant executed on June 21st at FECHTER'S residence in Creston, the clothes that SELEY was wearing, were located and seized. The shirt SELEY was wearing appeared to have been cleaned by hand. The stain on the shirt appeared to be consistent with blood. The clothing was submitted to the DCI crime lab for analysis.

On June 20th, at 2:11 pm, SELEY approached WAYLON CLAYTON, a friend of FECHTER and SELEY. SELEY told CLAYTON that SELEY had taken FECHTER to the woods and left him. CLAYTON said that SELEY also told him that he (SELEY) and FECHTER got into a fight and that he (SELEY) had took FECHTER'S truck and cellular phone. SELEY told CLAYTON that he (SELEY) knew that FECHTER had health issues. CLAYTON reported this information to law enforcement on June 21st.

On June 21st, LORI GRAHAM, SELEY and FECHTER'S sister, told law enforcement that she had received a call from SELEY in the early morning hours of the 20th. GRAHAM said that SELEY told her he (SELEY) and FECHTER had gotten into a fight and that (he) SELEY had left FECHTER out on a dirt road and had taken his pickup and cellular phone. GRAHAM said that the afternoon of the 20th, she had met with SELEY in Creston. GRAHAM said that SELEY told her that FECHTER'S truck needed gas. GRAHAM said that she met with SELEY and that he was in possession of FECHTER'S truck. GRAHAM told law enforcement that FECHTER has health conditions and that SELEY also knew FECHTER had health problems.

On June 22nd, HEAVEN CABALLERO-LARA was interviewed by DCI Agents. CABALLERO-LARA is the daughter of SELEY. CABALLERO-LARA told Agents that SELEY had called her on June 21st. CABALLERO-LARA said that SELEY repeatedly told her that "Tim was gone". CABALLERO-LARA said she didn't understand what SELEY meant and she asked SELEY if FECHTER was dead. CABALLERO-LARA said that SELEY told her that he (SELEY) had killed FECHTER.

On June 29th SELEY was interviewed by DCI Agents reference the disappearance of FECHTER. SELEY told Agents that he (SELEY) and FECHTER had drove out into the country to dump shingles. SELEY told Agents that he (SELEY) and FECHTER had gotten into an argument and that the last time he (SELEY) saw FECHTER was when he (SELEY) drove away in FECHTER'S pickup truck.


On June 29th, MARK NORMANDEAU was interviewed by DCI Agents. NORMANDEAU had brought SELEY into Creston from rural Union County. NORMANDEAU told Agents that SELEY had approached him (NORMANDEAU) and asked for a ride into Creston. NORMANDEAU told Agents that during the drive into Creston, SELEY told him (NORMANDEAU) that he had "popped that boy".

On July 1st, a search area was developed by looking at data from the cellular RadiolTE files. The target area for the search was in rural area in Adair County, southwest of Macksburg. Deputies with the Adair County Sheriff's office, located a body in farm field adjacent to 320th Avenue.

The scene was processed by the DCI Crime Scene Technicians and the body was transported to the Iowa Office of the State Medical Examiner. While processing the scene, a spent .380 caliber shell casing was located near the body.

On July 2nd, an autopsy was conducted at the Iowa Office of the Medical Examiner in Ankeny. During the autopsy, technicians were able to obtain a finger print from the body. This print was sent to the DCI crime lab. The latent fingerprint technicians were able to compare the print to known prints in the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS). The print obtained from the body was that of TIMOTHY FECHTER.

On August 6th, ISOME Pathologist Dr. Michele Catellier advised that the death of TIMOTHY FECHTER was caused by a single gunshot wound to the head. Dr. Catellier also observed blunt force trauma to FECHTER'S head. Dr. Catellier ruled FECHTER'S death a Homicide.
